


Selecting the Workflow Manager as the Default Home Screen

ProScript Connect enables you to amend the default home screen to either the Workflow Manager or Patient Search tab. The *Default Home Screen* configuration sets which tab will be shown first when starting the application.

1. From the ProScript Connect Main Screen, click **ProScript Connect** > **Edit Application Settings**.
2. The Edit Application Settings window displays, with the *Default* Category selected. Locate the *Default Home Screen* configuration setting.
3. Activate the setting for *All Machines* or *This Machine* by clicking the ▼ arrow, if required
